	There were 41 applications received with military training, and 40 licenses granted; With one application pending additional information needed.
10.	The Board is working with the NC Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers to get SB718 the Social Work Licensure Compact bill passed. The compact legislation has received the required adoption by seven states and the commission is forming to begin offering multistate licenses.

11. The Board is preparing to undergo the periodic review of existing rules for 21 NCAC 63. This report is scheduled for review by the Rules Review Commission (RRC) at their July 2025 meeting and the filing deadline for the Board is June 20, 2025.
