A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, North Carolina is dedicated to further strengthening our state's longstanding relationship with the Department of Defense and Department of Homeland Security, in part by providing the unique support and active outreach that military communities need, and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Military and Veterans Affairs manages and maintains the North Carolina Scholarship for Children of Wartime Veterans in appreciation for the service and sacrifices of North Carolina war veterans, and

WHEREAS, the Month of the Military Child gives an opportunity to recommit to providing our military communities with the necessary resources to support public education, strengthen essential infrastructure, and address the needs of the over 50,000 military children in North Carolina whose parent or guardian serves our nation as a member of the Armed Forces, and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages our communities, local and state government leaders, private organizations, and businesses to join in commending the children and youth of military families for their exceptional devotion to their loved ones serving as members of the Armed Forces;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2022, as "**MONTH OF THE MILITARY CHILD**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
